Early last year we were approached by Richard Hutchinson with an idea to use volunteers who were willing to help out in various community issues by providing basic research and fact gathering to assist the Selectmen in crafting policies and recommendations for the Town. The MRC and PERC solid waste issue became high on the list of issues with a deadline of the 2016 Town Meeting. With a small group of volunteers from our community, using a unique problem-solving approach created by Dick, they quickly were able to bring much needed information to Town Meeting, allowing an informed decision by those present to continue with PERC for our municipal solid waste solution.
